Since its founding in 1951, the Huron County Museum has been welcoming visitors and telling the stories of Huron County through exhibits and a vast collection of local artifacts. While the Museum has seen expanded collections and increased visitor numbers, the mission has stayed the same: to engage and inspire the next generation of Huron County residents by sparking an interest in local heritage and culture.

While we are proud of how far the Museum has come over the past seven decades, now is the time to set our sights even higher. The Museum's current five-year plan articulates the need to engage with more people to increase a shared understanding of the County's culture, leading to a greater social interconnection and stronger Huron County roots. We are in the process of a major redevelopment to exhibition spaces to better reflect the stories of Huron County.

BIG IDEA: The dynamic nature of industry has transformed Huron County and its people in many ways.

Huron County has a surprising and incredibly diverse history of innovation and history. For centuries, the people of the area have manufactured things to use and to trade; from stone tools to pottery, from bicycles to steam engines, baseball bats, fountain pens, craft beer, and more!

To better reflect this important history, the Museum's Industry Gallery has been identified as a space requiring large scale change. Initial steps to determine future exhibition plans included community and staff consultation, as well as analysis of visitor usage.

An Informal Request for Proposal for redevelopment of the Industry Gallery exhibition was circulated to exhibit development firms familiar with the Museum field. James Jensen, of Jensen Design, Cambridge, was awarded the contract to complete redevelopment of interpretive plans for the space.

The renovated gallery will be focused on thematic clusters and will be built upon a foundational "big idea".

The goal is to have full installation completed by late 2023. The current exhibit space will be closed in October 2022 in order for artifacts and exhibit components to be removed, the space redeveloped, and a whole new exhibit gallery with current stories retold and new stories added.
